



# OPEN CLASS

## FARM PRODUCTS

Maximum 2 entries per person per class

1. Premiums will be awarded only if the article meets requirements and is deemed worthy.
2. Any spoiled produce will be removed before the fair's end.
3. Judging of entries will take place Thursday at 4 p.m.
4. Garden Display & GreenThumb Display: Each exhibitor is limited to four square feet of space. Exhibits must include five or more different fresh vegetables. Canned vegetables are not permitted. Only one variety of each specific vegetable may be displayed. The quantities for the vegetables to be exhibited are as follows:

### Large Vegetables – (1) each:

Watermelon, Pumpkin, Cabbage, Squash, Eggplant, Cantaloupe, or similarly sized vegetables.

### Medium Vegetables – (5) each:

Cucumbers, Tomatoes, Carrots, Beets, Onions, Peppers, Parsnips, Okra, Potatoes, or similar vegetables.

For small fresh vegetables, such as green beans, a dozen is recommended for an effective display if used as one of the five different vegetables. Shelled vegetables should not be exhibited. The quality and condition of the exhibit will be considered. Choose vegetables that will maintain their appearance throughout the fair. Avoid overripe specimens; slightly underripe or immature picks may last longer.

Garden Display Exhibits will be judged on quality (40 points), quantity (40 points), and arrangement or display (20 points). The Green Thumb Display will be judged on quality (40 points), quantity (30 points), and creativity of display (30 points).

### Vegetables (Bunches of 5)

1. Cut tops to 1"-2" in length. Cover vegetables with plastic for better preservation.

### Legume Seed Classes (1 gallon in wide-mouth jar)

1. Soybean seed (oil variety)
